Spirits RAMpant?

Well, that was what a score of eager ASSAP investigators were hoping for when they gathered over the weekend of the 15th and 16th of April at the Ancient Ram Inn at Wotton-under-Edge in Gloucestershire for an on-site field study of one of the (allegedly) most haunted buildings in the country.

Over the two nights evidence of major paranormal activity was strangely lacking despite the awesome reputation of the Ram. Not for us the hectic and heady excitement so beloved of the M*st Haunted team although there were a number of curious minor incidents to enliven our stay.

On the Friday night the most interesting event was a sudden feeling of cold experienced by one investigator during a relaxing session in the Bishop's Room. It was originally thought that this must have been psychological in origin since a

digital thermometer registered no change in the ambient temperature, but other members of the team reported being able to sense the same temperature changes in a well-defined range at around chest height and a corresponding *increase* above head-height. Whether this was due to suggestion or some external cause remains open to debate. Interestingly, two of the Saturday team reported that the front parts of their bodies felt considerably colder than their backs when in the same area (despite an absence of draughts to explain such a dichotomy in both cases).

Furthermore there were a number of tactile events reported on Saturday which make interesting reading. These include one AI's hand being 'prodded' by something unseen, another investigator feeling a sensation of 'headache pressure' and, most curiously of all, a strange 'presence' breathing heavily into another's ear.

There were also some odd sightings reported during the weekend; nothing especially distinct but a plethora of 'dark shapes' and fleeting glimpses of things unknown. A number of strange lights were seen; some of which turned out to be embarrassingly mundane, some of which did not; none of which managed to make it onto any CCTV recordings. Many visitors to the Ram, not to mention the owner John Humphries, have reported seeing similar dark shapes at various times—could these glimpses have been of the strange being that John refers to as *'the incubus'*?

One Saturday night investigator experienced a sudden static shock and was left with a rather strange rash afterwards (although, whether this was strictly speaking a paranormal event is unknown but it is an interesting incident nonetheless.)

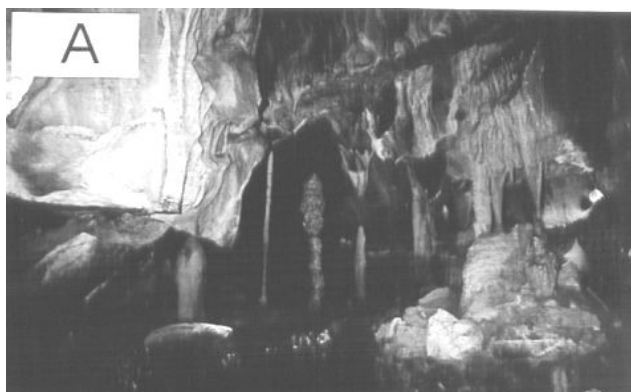

Research Update

Deputy NRC James Clark reports back on the Great Dream Experiment

Introduction

The basic idea behind this experiment was for participants to attempt to see/predict what was inside a sealed envelope. In this respect, this was like a remote-viewing experiment. Unlike a "traditional" RV experiment, however, participants were asked to try to gain information about the envelope's contents through their dreams.



A participant's accuracy at describing the contents of the envelope before it was opened might indicate an ability either to remotely view the contents or to predict what would be seen when the envelope was opened. A third possibility (an ability to access information in the experimenter's mind through some sort of ESP) was guarded against by ensuring that nobody, including the experimenter, knew what was in the envelope before it was opened. This was done in the following way.

First, four images were selected, each of which was judged to be suitably different from the others. Nobody but the experimenter knew what these images were. Each of these images was then sealed in a separate unmarked envelope. For security, the seals were signed and dated by the experimenter and a witness, and were taped over with clear tape. (At no time did the witness see any of the images.) With the experimenter out of the room, a third person who was otherwise unconnected with the experiment randomly chose one of the four sealed envelopes. This third person was instructed to divide the envelopes into two groups of two, and then flip a coin to select one group, and flip the coin again to choose one envelope in that group. The selected envelope was then marked with a cross. With the target image now selected, all four sealed envelopes were filed away in a secure location.

An article appealing for participants was placed in ASSAP News 103 (November 2004). People who responded were instructed as to what to do and were invited to begin participation in the experiment as soon as they wished. The experiment was divided into two parts, as follows:

Summary of Part One

Part One of this experiment was designed to allow participants to respond freely with descriptions, sketches, etc of whatever they believed the envelope's contents to be. During this part of the experiment, which ran until the morning of Saturday 18 December 2004, participants were encouraged to keep brief notes of their dreams. At the end of this part, participants looked back over their notes and sent in their impressions of what the target image might be.

Summary of Part Two

Part Two of the experiment was designed to allow a more statistical analysis of the results. For this part, participants were shown four different images. These were the four images from which one had been randomly selected as the target image before the experiment began. Now participants were asked to rank each image from 1 to 4 in order of how likely they believed it was to be the target image. A rank of 1 was given to the "most likely" image and a rank of 4 to the "least likely". Participants were asked to make their choices without discussing them with anyone else.



Summary of Outcome

In the end, only 10 participants completed both parts of this experiment. Despite the small number, this was enough to at least make a preliminary study. Hopefully, the experiment can be re-run at a future date with more participants and once any difficult areas have been ironed out. Advertising the experiment outside ASSAP should bring in more participants.

As for the results, there were not any definite "hits" from Part One of the experiment. When the envelope was opened, the target image was found to be Image C, the photograph of a fountain. The small prize (a book token) for the best prediction was awarded to Participant 8 whose description and sketch of a "Victorian water pump" (coupled with his comment for Part Two that, of the four images presented, the fountain photograph image stood out immediately as the correct answer) was deemed to be the closest match of any of the entries.

Of the 10 participants, three gave Image C, the fountain photograph, a ranking of 1 (most likely to be the target image.). This is no more than would be expected by chance. (Statistically, 2.5 people out of 10 would guess correctly by chance.)

When the rankings were analysed more closely, however, something interesting did emerge. The total scores for each image were calculated and compared with each other. (For example, if everyone had picked Image C as their first choice, that would have received 10 scores of 1, totalling 10. On the other hand, if everyone had picked that image as their fourth choice, it would have received 10 scores of 4, totalling 40.) When this was done for each image, the scores were as follows:



Image A total = 25
 Image B total = 29
 Image C (target image) total = 18
 Image D total = 28

From these scores, it does seem that there was something about Image C that made participants feel it was relatively likely to have been the target.



This needn't mean it was a paranormal effect, however. It is possible that there is something about this particular image that makes people associate it with dreams and that it was purely coincidental that this image just happened to have been the one randomly selected as the target. In other words, participants might have ranked it as likely even if it *hadn't* been the target. (This is an area that will need ironing out before future runs of this experiment are made. It may have been an error, for example, to have used one black-and-white and three colour images.) This possibility is being looked into at the moment and it will be interesting to see if the "paranormal" explanation stands up.

Research Request

Andy Owens writes:

I am currently researching for a new book to be entitled 'Night Stalkers: a Worldwide Investigation into the Animal Mutilation Mystery and wondered if any ASSAP members knew of any British cases of animal/cattle mutilations which could help me in my research.

Since at least 1967 animals—particularly farm livestock—have been found dead with parts of their bodies removed, often with the apparent assistance of unknown heat technology. Eyes, ears, organs, blood, tails, genital rectal areas, and soft tissue around the eyes and mouth have been missing; occasionally a tiny hole has been found drilled through the animal's forehead. The cause of death and motive have remained unknown. There are no discernible footprints, tyre tracks, or traces of blood around the body, and the animals are often found to have suffered broken limbs as if they have been dropped from a great height.

In the USA alone there have been an estimated 10,000 cattle deaths, and with other countries such as the UK, Australia and Europe included, the figure may even be doubled or tripled. Wild animals and domestic pets have also occasionally been found with similar injuries.

Inevitably, there are a lot of theories to account for the Phenomenon ranging from Satanists and UFOs to covert military projects. MY attempt in this book is to discover just how widespread this phenomenon is - and hopefully come to some sort of conclusion as to who or what is responsible

I am particularly interested in borrowing or buying a book by UFOlogist Tony Dodd entitled *Alien Investigator* which apparently details several British cases. I have enquired to ASSAP archives/library officer James Clark - but do any other ASSAP members own a copy?

The ONE TIME I forget to mention there isn't a prize I get a correct answer... Congratulations to Michael Lewis and I owe you a beer.

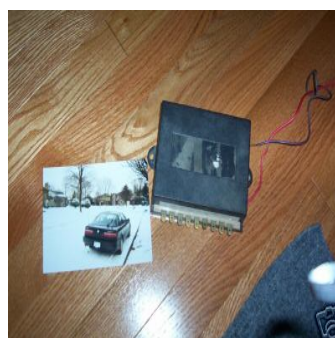

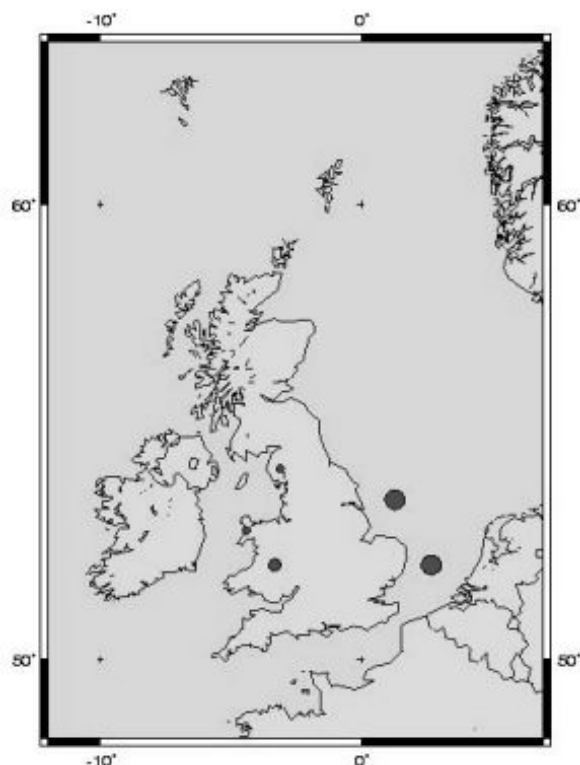

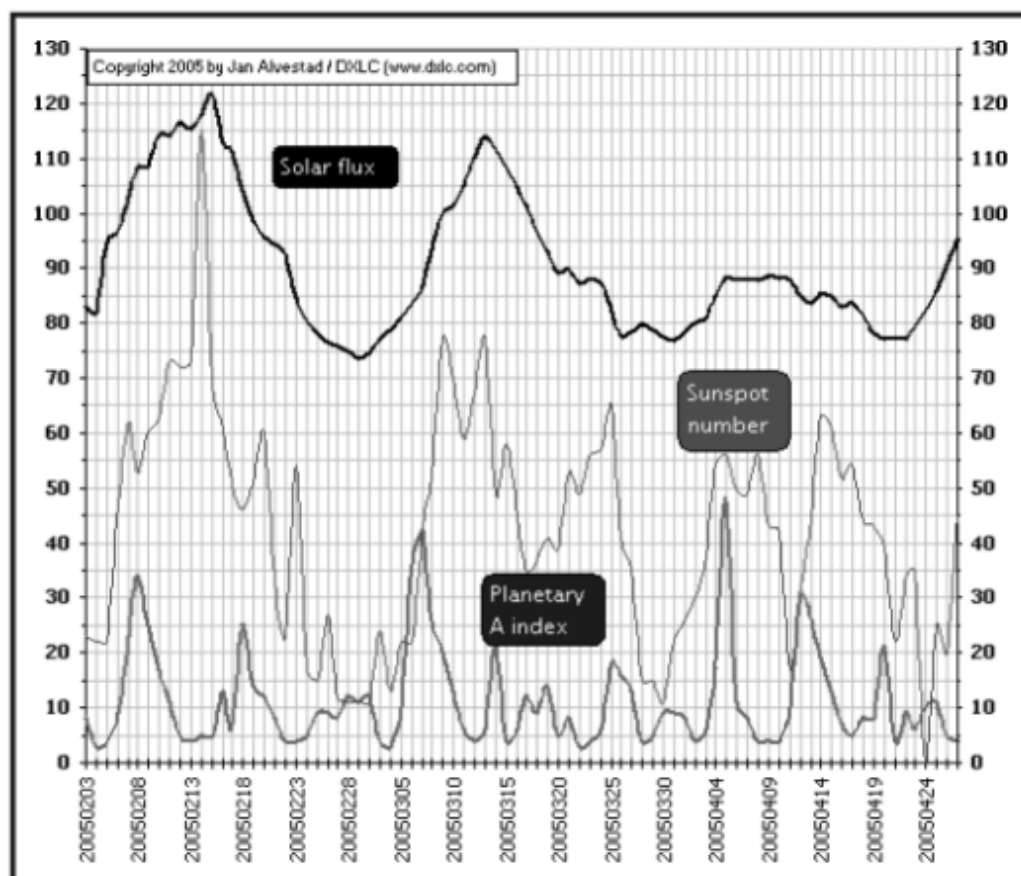
